





TRIPLE TROUBLE: COVID-19 VARIANT SURGE AND RISING DENGUE & CHIKUNGUNYA CASES THREATEN PUBLIC **HEALTH**

As Bangladesh faces simultaneous outbreaks of COVID-19, dengue, and chikungunya during monsoon, an urgent, unified public health response is critical to prevent a national crisis.

As monsoon rains intensify, Bangladesh finds itself grappling with not just one but three concurrent public health threats: a resurgent COVID-19 variant, a sharp rise in dengue cases and fatalities, and a renewed presence of chikungunya, all of which are straining healthcare systems and testing national preparedness.

COVID-19 Resurgence: A Growing Concern

After months of relative quiet, COVID-19 is re-emerging in Bangladesh. As of June 23, 2025, over 408 confirmed cases and 16 fatalities have been reported this year, with all the deaths occurring in June alone (DGHS, 2025). Hospitals such as the DNCC Dedicated COVID-19 Hospital in Mohakhali are witnessing a surge in daily outdoor patients where the numbers have doubled in a week reflecting growing community transmission and limited early detection. Testing resources are being expanded, but shortages persist in districts beyond Dhaka, underscoring the urgent need for decentralised diagnostics and consistent supply chains.

Dengue Deaths Rise, Particularly Outside Dhaka

At the same time, dengue continues its annual rampage. According to DGHS data, 7,758 dengue cases and 32 deaths have been reported from January to June 22, 2025. Alarmingly, over 75% of infections and most deaths occurred outside of major city corporation areas, especially in divisions like Barishal and Chattogram. Barishal accounts for 3,583 cases, followed by Chattogram (1,174), outside

(January 01, 2025 - June 22, 2025)




of DCC (730), and Khulna (226). Dhaka North and South City Corporations (DNCC & DSCC) reported 618 and 1,093 cases respectively. These statistics highlight a shift in dengue's epicentre from urban Dhaka to more vulnerable, less-equipped peripheral areas. The rise has been attributed to poor mosquito control, inadequate drainage, and

year-round breeding grounds. In many regions, communities remain unaware of basic preventive practices, while coordinated fogging and source reduction efforts remain limited. Experts suggest this year's serotype (DEN-1 to DEN-4) diversity could also be causing more severe illness, increasing the case fatality rate (The Daily Star, 2025)

Chikungunya & Vector-Borne Diseases Resurface

Adding to the burden, chikungunya has reappeared, primarily in Dhaka. Between January and May 2025, Institute of Epidemiology Disease Control And Research (IEDCR) confirmed 153 cases out of 337 samples tested. The actual numbers could be higher due to limited PCR-based diagnostic access, leading to underreporting. Though generally non-fatal, chikungunya causes prolonged joint pain

and swelling, affecting productivity and quality of life. Its overlapping symptoms with dengue such as high fever, joint pain, rashes, etc. complicate clinical diagnosis and delay in appropriate care.

Healthcare professionals are also observing a rise in seasonal influenza and typhoid, contributing further to hospital congestion (The Business Standard, 2025).

Overburdened Hospitals and Delayed Response

The current outbreak is further complicated by delays in hospital admissions, particularly among denaue patients. Late arrivals contribute significantly to the rising death toll. Public hospitals are witnessing increasing load, with some already admitting more than 550-600 patients daily for combined febrile illnesses. Despite resource mobilisation, including test kits and saline stockpiles, healthcare providers remain concerned about reaching peak capacity if the current trend continues through the monsoon (The Daily Star, 2025).

Need for Coordinated Public Health Response

The surge in dengue, chikungunya, and COVID-19 exposes weaknesses in Bangladesh's health preparedness. Experts call for sustained vector control, community involvement, and stronger diagnostic systems to curb mosquito-borne diseases, while maintaining COVID-19 precautions like wearing mask and testing. Stagnant water sources must be eliminated to disrupt Aedes mosquito breeding from all sectors whether it is household, construction site or anywhere near us.

Bangladesh's overlapping health crises demand urgent, coordinated action. A decentralized strategy- combining prevention, public awareness, and multi-sector efforts—is essential to mitigate the impact of these diseases amid climate challenges and urbanization pressures. Without swift intervention, the burden on the healthcare system will worsen.
